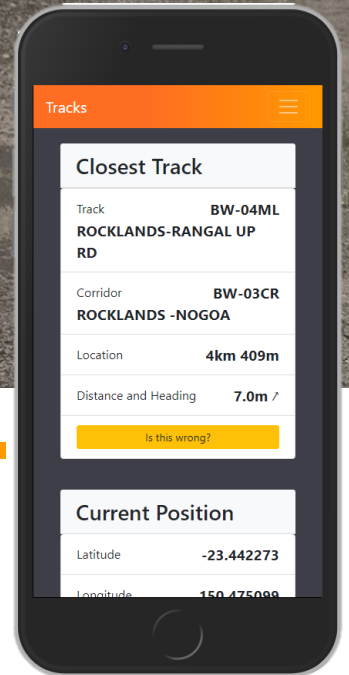

Tracks is an apto help you locate your position on the Aurizon network

What does it do?

Tracks will allow you to identify your current position in relation to the Aurizon Network. This will help standardise location referencing for field work and make it easy to get the right track codes.

Track and corridor codes are supplied from NAMS, to make filling out forms easy. It should match pretty closely to the field markers, like what you see on overhead masts and kilometre posts.

In busy multiple track areas, like yards and at crossovers, there is a *Nearby Tracks* table to help you identify the right track.

How it works?

Tracks works by using the GPS in your phone to locate you, against the Aurizon Network model.

Download it to your phone by going to:

tracks.aurizon.com.au

Once it is loaded, you can save it so that it works offline. This will add an icon to your home screen and let you use it offline. In iPhone Safari, hit the **Share** button, then **Add to Home Screen**.

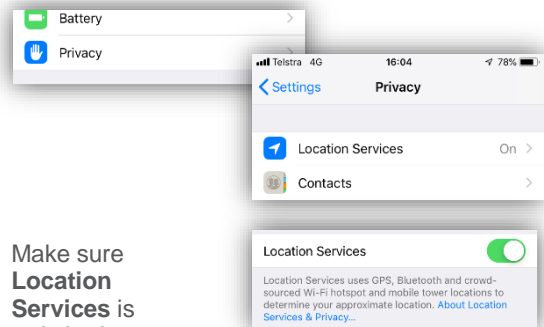

Having trouble?

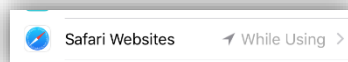
You may need to first enable Location Services to the web browser to ensure that the browser can see your location to determine your track position.

If you are using an iPhone using Safari browser:

1. From the home screen, open **Settings**
2. Navigate through **Privacy** and **Location Services**



3. Make sure **Location Services** is switched on.
4. Scroll down to **Safari Websites** and ensure it is checked to *While using the app*.
